 - **Land use planning**

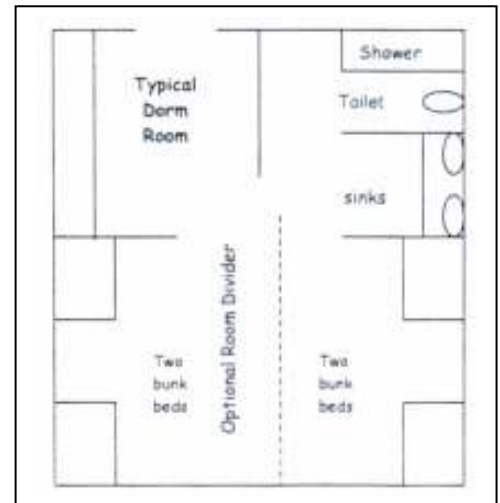


Eagle Bluff Accommodations:

There are 31 dorm rooms, four of which are accessible to those with disabilities. Seventeen rooms are semiprivate suites containing two separate sleeping areas. Each sleeping area contains two bunk beds. The remaining 14 rooms contain four bunk beds in one large room. Each room sleeps a maximum of eight people.

All rooms have a private bathroom, shower, two side-by-side sinks, and eight individual storage compartments. **Linens and towels are available at an additional \$5 per person charge.** Room assignments will be made at registration desk.

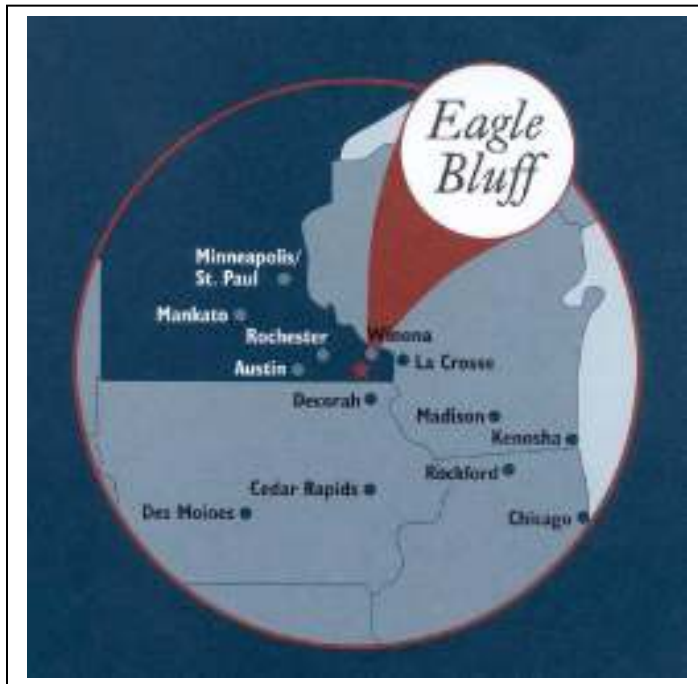
How to Find Eagle Bluff Environmental Center

From the north or south:

Take Hwy 52 to Fountain, MN. Travel east on Hwy 8 for 7 miles. Turn left on County Road 21 and travel 1 ¼ miles to Goodview Drive. Turn right and travel 2 ½ miles to Eagle Bluff.

From the east or west:

Take Hwy 16 to Lanesboro, MN. Travel north on Parkway Avenue for ½ mile. Turn left on County Hwy 8 and travel 2 miles. Turn right on County Road 21 and travel 1 ¼ miles to Goodview Drive. Turn right and travel 2 ½ miles to Eagle Bluff.
