Stefan Jackson hired as new diversity consultant for TU

In March, TU hired Stefan J. Jackson of NATURAL DIFFERENCE, LLC, to serve as our Diversity Consultant. Working part-time out of his office on the shores of Moose Pond in Bridgton, Maine, Stefan's primary focus at TU is to assist with the Women's Initiative, building on the great work done there.

Stefan has a 20-year track-record in natural resource and communitybased conservation leadership always integrating if not concentrating work on organizational diversity. Stefan helped guide the National Outdoor Leadership School's successful women's initiative and he also created the position of and served as the Diversity Program Director for the Nature Conservancy in Maine.

At TU, Stefan will also be responsible for driving new initiatives to diversify the membership, helping the broader TU community become more welcoming and inclusive, and playing an advisory role to marketing and communications on representation issues.


"I see my work as helping TU design and implement streams of engagement that are both continuous and mutually reinforcing to both the folks stewarding the streams and those navigating in the currents." Stefan lives at Winona Camps for Boys, with Laura H. Ordway, co-Director and co-owner of Winona, and Stefanie (13) and Jacqueline (9), their two daughters.

"Everybody in our cabin loves reading streams, and our tempers roll with Moose Pond's currents and hatches."

"In my first couple of months at TU, I have witnessed the incredible dedication and commitment of the volunteer corps and staff. I have heard great stories from TU women – lessons learned and taught. Women leaders who came to the organization as young women or girls: from some whose commitment clearly endured being inequitably tested, from others whose dedication only magnified as they found all opportunities open and resources available to them."

One of the areas where Stefan believes volunteers can make a significant, and lasting impact on the organization, and on the diversity initiative, is through our youth programs.

"TU meets 30-40 thousand kids a year with Trout/Salmon in the Classroom programs, thousands more at other community outreach events. Just imagine how many future coldwater fisheries stewards, how many future women TU mem-

bers, how many future women leaders, how many girls would swim downstream to lead TU in the future, if we could expand the streams of engagement started with Trout/Salmon in the Classroom and carried downstream with Trout Camp, Summer on the Fly, Stream Girls, TU Teen Summit, and the 5 Rivers Clubs!"
