The Survey Says: TU Diversity is ... On the Rise!

Trout Unlimited's National Leadership Council (NLC) Women Initiative (WI) Workgroup was formed in 2011 at the TU Annual Meeting after a group of women met to discuss ways that TU can be more welcoming to women. Information gleaned from a women-only survey offered to TU members by National TU propelled that first gathering.

That first diversity-focused survey found that a large number of TU women fly fish (86%) and would prefer to fish at women only events (58%). Informed this first survey, the WI Workgroup developed a mission statement, multi-media materials, and event planning guidance to be used at the chapter and state level in offering women only events.

With the development of the WI chair at the chapter and state level, offering these events has been the hallmark of the success of the WI in bringing more women into TU and the development of more women TU leaders. Last year, the executive team of the WI/DI Workgroup decided to revisit the idea of another women's survey to see what the membership thinks about the WI and what attracts more women to TU. We worked with TU Marketing and Volunteer Operations staff and developed another survey. This

time, the survey would be available to all TU members.

The survey went live in April 2016 and ended at the end of the year. With a large number of survey responses and the expert help of Don Haynes from Maryland, we were able to develop substantive conclusions from the results. We had 4212 people respond to the survey. We had 363 out of 386 chapters represented, which is a good representation from across the states. With this survey open to all genders, 11% self-identified as women and of these, 13% identified themselves as women leaders. Women joined TU to participate in conservation (44%) and improve trout habitat (78%) but they also want to meet other people who fish (38%). Women also would prefer fishing events (82%) and would still prefer women only events (63%). This number is even higher than the previous survey. We were startled to find that both women (27%) and men (32%) had never heard of TU's Women Initiative but as we looked at active status, we found that many of these respondents were not active at their local chapter. Familiarity with the WI increased as the active level of the respondents increased -- up to 79%. Activity status also correlates when respondents are asked if the WI has had a positive impact. Of those who were active in TU, 85% of both men and women agreed that the WI has had a positive impact.

The results of this survey verify to the DI Workgroup that we are on target in making TU more welcoming to women, engaging more women in TU, and developing more women leaders. The new executive team of the DI Workgroup will be using these results to develop a new Strategic Plan to move the Workgroup forward in the next 5 years. 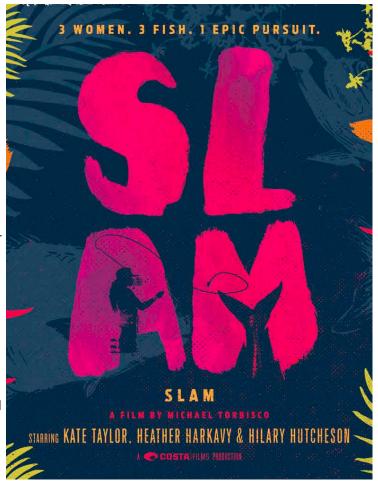
Special COSTA SLAM Screening Offer for TU Chapters
