# Kerri, Kelly & Jackie bring a wealth of experience and passion to TU

#### Kerri Russell—Chair

Kerri has been a TU member for over 14 years and has served as a leader in TU at the chapter, state, and national level. She currently represents Arkansas on the National Leadership Council of TU and is chair of the Women's Initiative and Land Conservancy Workgroups. She also is the Arkansas TU State Council WI Chair as well as the WI Ambassador for the Mid-South



region. Kerri is also involved with Casting For Recovery, a fly-fishing wellness retreat for breast cancer survivors, where she has been the coordinator and medical facilitator in Arkansas for over 10 years.

#### Kelly E. Buchta—Vice-Chair

Kelly is the Northeast Regional VP and Women's Initiative Coordinator for NJ State Council TU. She also serves as the Vice-Chair for the NLC Women's Initiative workgroup and is the WI Ambassador for the Mid-Atlantic. In addition, she is a trustee at the Catskill Fly Fishing Center and Museum. When not teaching literature, she is either tying classic wet



flies or smiling in a stream somewhere in the Northeast.

#### Jackie Jordan—Secretary

Jackie joined TU in 2011 at the same time she started fly fishing. In her first year she joined her Southwestern Vermont Chapter's Board and became involved in the Women's Initiative Workgroup. She then moved onto becoming Chapter Vice President and later Chapter President and Secretary of the WI Workgroup. She is the WI Chair for Vermont and the WI Ambassador for the Northeast.



## TU's Women's Initiative: A Brief History & Update

The Women's Initiative Workgroup of the NLC was started in 2011 at the TU Annual Meeting to address the concern that only 6% of all TU members were women, while at the same time women made up 36% of all anglers in the U.S.

A mission statement and objectives were developed by the workgroup:

To create effective strategies and programs to recruit more women in TU, encourage more women to accept leadership roles at the chapter, state, and national levels, and ensure every chapter creates a welcoming environment for women members to achieve the stated TU conservation mission.

In 2013 and 2014, TU created two campaigns to recruit more women through free membership drives and half-price renewal offers.

Workgroup members focused on the grassroots level to engage and recruit women members.

A Women's Initiative chair position was established at the chapter and state level to help promote these drives and drive the initiative forward locally.

The workgroup started with only five initiative chairs, but now there are over 40 across the country and it is continues to grow!

A woman's retreat was organized in conjunction with TU's Annual



Women members of TU are strong volunteers, dedicated leaders and active members in their local chapters. The more women we recruit, engage and encourage to step up, the more leaders we will have to share the workload.

Meeting in 2012. As the regional meetings have grown, Women's Initiative trainings were added in 2013 and these meetings continue to provide educational opportunities for chapter leaders who want to increase and retain their women membership.

The workgroup has established a range of resources for TU chapter and council leaders in the online Tacklebox (go to www.tu.org/women to view them).

Included among these resources are: a Women's Initiative Action Plan, a Women Retention Plan, event ideas and planning documents, brochures and flyers, a Women in TU promotional video, PowerPoint presentations, membership rosters, and more.

The workgroup has initiated more

media coverage of Women in TU as evident in quarterly articles in Trout Magazine, Orvis News blog articles, Dun Magazine article, and a recent exposure at the Somerset NJ Flyfishing show with a TU women event.

# Over 10,000 more women have joined TU since this initiative has started which is a 25% increase in women membership!

Women TU events are now happening across the country and the movement is gaining strength.
