- Silver Carp


Populations <u>increasing</u> (with evidence of reproduction in the wild)

What Does "Establishment" Look Like?






Presence of <u>all</u> life stages (eggs, larvae, juveniles, and adults)





Key Schedule Drivers

- Completion of Chief's Report
 - Non-federal sponsor
 - Internal & external reviews
- Non-federal sponsor/cost share agreements
- Availability of PED funds in FY20
- Complex innovative designs increase PED duration
- Construction authorization & appropriation
- Maintaining navigation during construction extends duration
