
Our Model of Inclusivity





- Sponsored Start-up of Knoxville Program in 2012
- Volunteers Support All Activities of the Program
 - Average Eight (8) Fishing Events per Season
 - Monthly Meetings, Fly Tying Classes, Rod Building, Casting Instruction
- Some Joint Events with Wounded Warriors












Lessons Learned from PHWFF

- Invite PHWFF to Participate in All Activities
- Focused Veterans Activities Beyond PHWFF (New)



Non-Disabled Veterans



- Many Came to PHWFF but were Ineligible
- Can Be Just As Damaged As the Officially Disabled
- Lasting Effects from Combat Experiences
- Need for Camaraderie and Therapeutic Activities
- Clinch River Chapter Decided to Make a Start
