The Headwaters Advisory Board is a dedicated group focused on connecting young people with the outdoors. Board members include business leaders, outdoor industry professionals, and educators who share a common passion for youth development and conservation efforts across the country.

BOARD COMMITMENT

Meetings & Events: Advisory Board members are invited to quarterly events every year. These include two (2) in-person events focused on fishing, networking, and volunteering to help our youth programs and two (2) virtual meetings to discuss board and youth program updates.

Philanthropic Commitment: Advisory Board members make charitable contributions to Headwaters ranging from \$5,000 to \$25,000+ annually. We want to make involvement with the Advisory Board accessible, with lower annual commitments considered if the incoming Board member can make commitments in-kind. Each person joining the Board will discuss their minimum annual giving commitment with the chair of the Headwaters Board and is expected to fulfill this commitment each year.

HOW WE WORK: GROWING UP TOGETHER

Headwaters Youth links and overlaps programs to connect young people with coldwater conservation and the natural world so each new experience is tailored to grow with them. We can and must do more: more educating, mentoring, informing, inspiring, and exploring, all with equitable access to these opportunities.

Joining the Headwaters Advisory Board is a forward-thinking investment in next generation of stewards. With your help, we will develop the next generation of conservationists and safeguard the future of our cherished watersheds with programs that include:

EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING FOR KIDS

Trout/Salmon in the Classroom teaches kids in over 5,000 classrooms about watershed health and conservation. STREAM Girls is an outdoor education program developed in partnership with Girl Scouts.

LEADERSHIP TRAINING FOR YOUNG ADULTS

TU Costa 5 Rivers is a network of 80+ college clubs aiming to create a generation of conservation-minded anglers. Annually, clubs connect 3,000 students with fly fishing trips, conservation projects, and leadership/career opportunities.

EDUCATIONAL TOOLS FOR SCHOOLS

Headwaters develops on and off line educational tools (like the interactive kids magazine *Stream Explorers*), which enable teachers across the country to build outdoor education into curriculum for their students.
